



Q1 How many years have you been a **Duxbury resident?**






Q2 Which voting precinct do you live in?






Q3 What is your age?






Q4 Do you have school-aged children?






Q5 If you do have school age children, are your children in:






Q6 Do you serve, or have you served, on any elected or appointed boards or committees?





Q7 Do you attend Town Meeting?






Q8 Town Meeting is presently held in March. Would you attend TM if it were held later in the year?








Q9 How do you feel about the Open Town **Meeting form of Government?**






Q10 Should the Town consider a Representative Town Meeting form of government?








Q11 How familiar are you with the Town budget, how it is developed, and how it impacts your taxes?








Q12 The Board of Selectmen is presently made up of three (3) members. Should the number of members of the Board of Selectmen be expanded?








Q13 The Town Clerk's position is presently elected. Should the Town Clerk position:







